



# Training courses for health and safety representatives snapshot 2021-22

The Work Health and Safety Commission require each provider to submit an annual report on the delivery of training courses for the year ending 30 June.

In 2021-22, 24 registered training organisations (RTO) were accredited to provide the training.

There were 432 training courses conducted with 169 of these in the non-metropolitan area. The class size in non-metropolitan area (12 persons) was larger than the metropolitan area (6 persons).

The maximum number of health and safety representatives (HSRs) trained by a single RTO was 909 and the minimum number was 4. One accredited RTO provided nil training in 201-22.

#### HSRs trained by occupation

Under WorkSafe (general) 859 (22%) plant and machine operators had the highest number of HSRs trained





Tradespersons (763) and professionals (655) represented the next highest numbers of HSRs trained

Salespersons and personal service workers had the lowest number at 109(3%)

## **HSRs** trained (per 1,000 workers)

From 2017-18 to 2021-22, mining has consistently had the highest number of HSRs



trained per thousand workers with an average of 12

In 2021-22, the number of HSRs trained per thousand mining workers was 11.4

### HSR courses conducted by region

**432** training courses were conducted with 169 (39%) of these training courses held in non-metropolitan areas



#### HSRs trained by jurisdiction

**2,174 of 3,882** (56%) HSRs trained are regulated by WorkSafe (general)



1,589 (41%) regulated by WorkSafe (Mines) 26 (1%) regulated by Seafarers 71 (2%) were regulated by others

In 2021-22 WorkSafe (Mines) had the highest number of HSRs trained at **1,539** (37%)

#### HSRs trained by region

**2.137 (57%)** of HSRs were trained in the nonmetropolitan area

Similar to previous years, 66% of (about two thirds) HSRs trained were **male**
