

Training courses for safety and health representatives snapshot 2020-21

The Commission guidelines and criteria for accreditation of training courses for safety and health representatives (SHReps) require each provider to submit an annual report on the delivery of introductory training courses for the year ending 30 June.

In 2020-21, 24 registered training organisations (RTOs) were accredited to provide the training.

Nine providers conducted courses exclusively in the metropolitan area, 6 in non-metropolitan areas, and 9 in both.

The highest number of SHReps trained by a single RTO was 1,000 and the least number was three. One accredited RTO provided nil training in 2020-21.

SHReps trained (per 1,000 workers)

From 2017-18 to 2020-21, mining has consistently had the highest number of SHReps trained per thousand workers with an average of 11.8

In 2020-21, the number of SHReps trained per thousand mining workers was **13.4**

SHReps courses conducted by region

397 training courses were conducted with **42%** per cent of these in **non-metropolitan areas** (166 courses)



SHReps trained by jurisdiction

2,535 of 4,207 (60%) SHReps trained are regulated by **WorkSafe**





1,557 (37%) regulated by Mines Safety

21 (0.5%) regulated by NOPSEMA

14 (less than 1%) regulated by Seafarers

SHReps trained by occupation

Under WorkSafe's jurisdiction 871 (21%) plant and machine operators had the highest number of SHReps trained



Tradespersons (805) and professionals (725) represented the next highest numbers of SHReps trained

Salespersons and personal service workers had the lowest percentage at 3%

SHReps trained by gender

Similar to previous years, **63%** of (about two thirds) SHReps trained were **male**
